Throughout her career at UC San Diego, she served various roles in support of students, such as Vice Chair of Undergraduate and Graduate Education in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry as well as member of the Academic Senate Educational Policy Committee. In 2018, she joined the leadership team in the Division of Graduate Education and Postdoctoral Affairs (GEPA) as Associate Dean, then served as Interim Dean for a year before being appointed Dean in July, 2025.
