Last week you received the Health Alert from Vice Chancellor- Student Affairs Satterlund and Interim Executive Director - Student Health and Well-Being Angela Scioscia. And if you have not already done so, please review the Return to Learn Plan for Winter Quarter 2021. If after reviewing, you have any questions about how the campus plan pertains to graduate or professional students, please feel free to email your academic program/department or my office--we are always happy to help.

## Below I want to highlight information specifically relevant to graduate and professional students.

- COVID-19 TESTING: As mentioned in the Campus notice last month and the recent Health Alert last week, weekly testing is now in effect. See details on the Return to Learn Winter 2021 Plan page. Note: All students living on-campus or coming to campus or any UC location/property for educational, research, co-curricular, recreational or social activities are required to conduct daily symptom screening and participate in nocost asymptomatic weekly testing. Students living in the San Diego area, studying remotely and not coming to campus or any UC property, are encouraged to participate in free asymptomatic testing twice a month (every 12-16 days). - **ADVISING**: Your academic program, as always, stands ready to offer you support and advising. You should not hesitate to reach out if you have questions about anything, including courses, funding, procedures for participating in research projects, and protocols for returning to labs.
- IN-PERSON TEACHING: If you are an Instructional Assistant (IA) please note that

current public health orders restrict teaching to outdoor in-person or remote modalities. See more under Winter Instruction on this page. As usual, each instructor may choose the teaching modality that is best for their class. If you need assistance, please reach out to your academic program director, department chair, and/or divisional dean's office; you also can contact The Graduate Division for additional support.

- ADDITIONAL EXTENSIONS OF TIME LIMITS: As detailed in the email from Dean Antony last month, the Graduate Council has approved additional extensions of time limits for doctoral students.
- EXCEPTION EXTENDED for ASEs & GSRs CHILDCARE REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM: The UC system has extended helpful updates that increased flexibility to the <a href="mailto:childcare reimbursement program for ASEs and GSRs">childcare reimbursement program for ASEs and GSRs</a>. - UPDATES ON GSGEI / NRST COVERAGE: The coverage of Non-Resident Supplemental Tuition (NRST) has now been extended by three additional quarters--UCSD will exclude four COVID-affected quarters [SP20, FA20, WI21, & SP21]--but see details/caveats in my Dec 7 announcement.
- GRADUATE DIVISION OPEN OFFICE HOURS: Are scheduled from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. (PT) on the following Fridays during Winter Quarter 2021: Jan 15, Feb 5, and Mar 5. Additionally, Return to Learn All Student Town Halls will continue to be held periodically.
